Contract content

Preamble: Naming of the parties involved; purpose of the marriage; naming of the marriage partners; confirmation of ratification; consent of the groom's family

- 1 Setting of the wedding date
- 2 Dowry set at 100,000 Reichstaler; payment arrangements; bride's trousseau arrangements; transfer of the bride arrangements
- 3 Promise by the groom to marry the bride and treat her appropriately; emphasis on the purpose of the marriage being to foster friendship between the two families
- 4 Investment of the dowry regulated; repayment if both spouses die without joint heirs
- 5 Morning gift in the amount of 8,000 Reichstaler; interest on the morning gift regulated
- 6 Specification of the widow's dower; rights to the dower; increase in the life estate and dower if the husband's financial situation improves
- 7 The widow retains the right to her dower and life estate if she decides to live outside Mecklenburg or remarry; Appointment of officials
- 8 Consent of the groom's brother, the Duke of Saxony and the Margrave of Brandenburg
- 9 Furnishing of the widow's residence in accordance with her status; reservations regarding the groom's rights to the widow's dower; homage paid by subjects regulated
- 10 Lutheran upbringing of the children stipulated; free practice of religion guaranteed for the bride
- 11 Bride dies before groom without common children: lifelong right of use of the groom's dowry; reversion of the 100,000 Reichstaler to Sweden; Bride dies before groom with joint children: 50,000 Reichstaler remain for use by the husband and the other 50,000 Reichstaler remain for use by the children; if the groom also dies, his 50,000 Reichstaler also go to the children
- 12 Remarriage of the groom regulated
- 13 Inheritance of the bride's personal property regulated
- 14 If one of the marriage partners dies before consummation of the marriage, the contract is void
- 15 Ratification; place; date

Confessional regulations

- 11 Bride dies before groom without children: lifelong right of use of the groom's dowry; reversion of 100,000 Reichstaler to Sweden; Bride dies before groom with children together: 50,000 Reichstaler remain for use by the husband and the other 50,000 Reichstaler remain for use by the children; if the groom also dies, his 50,000 Reichstaler also go to the children.
- 13 Inheritance of the bride's personal property regulated
